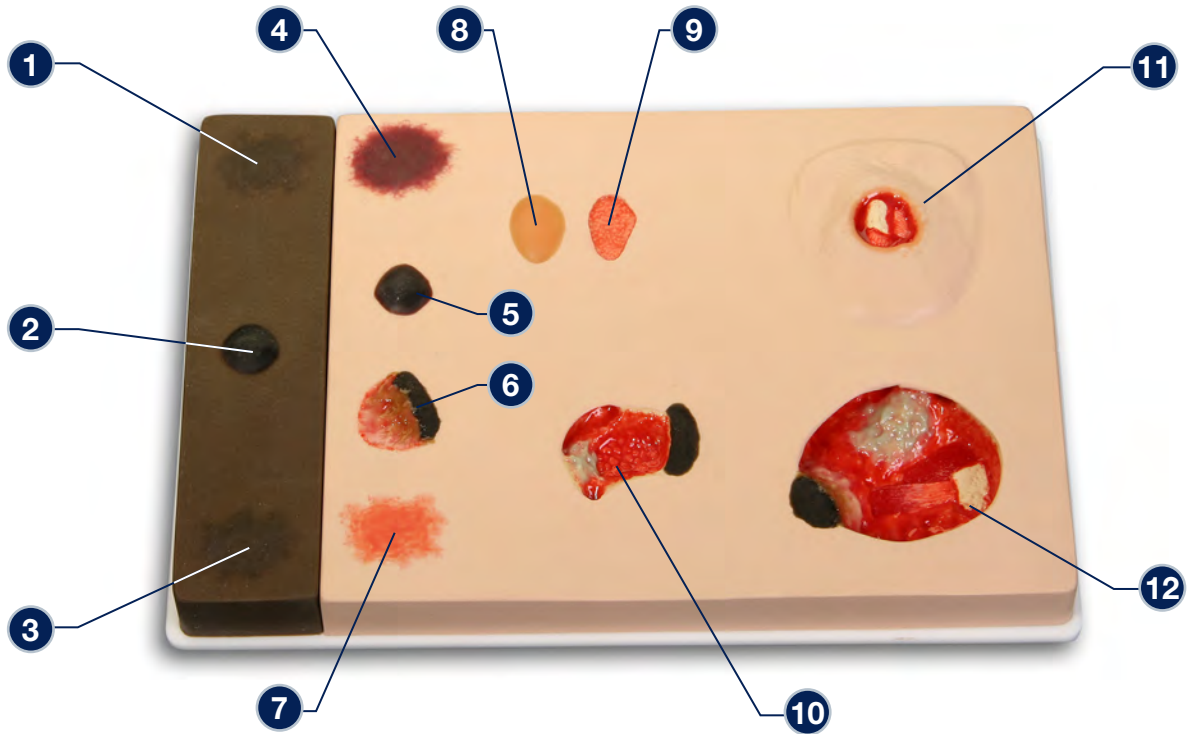


'Pat' Pressure Ulcer Staging Model™ - 0980



The following pressure ulcers* and wounds are presented on 'Pat' Pressure Ulcer Staging Model™

- 1 Suspected DTI (Deep Tissue Injury) with “mushy/boggy” feel when palpated on a darkly pigmented individual
- 2 Blood blister on a darkly pigmented individual
- 3 Stage I pressure ulcer on darkly pigmented individual, can also appear as “ashen gray”
- 4 Suspected DTI (Deep Tissue Injury) with “mushy/boggy” feel when palpated
- 5 Blood blister
- 6 Unstageable eschar/slough wound
- 7 Stage I pressure ulcer
- 8 Stage II Blister, intact
- 9 Stage II pressure ulcer
- 10 Stage III pressure ulcer with undermining, tunneling, granulation tissue, subcutaneous fat, eschar and slough
- 11 Stage IV pressure ulcer of malleolus, with exposed tendon and bone (with osteomyelitis)
- 12 Stage IV pressure ulcer with exposed tendons and muscle, undermining, tunneling, slough, eschar, subcutaneous fat and bone (with osteomyelitis)

* We have included the most likely etiology-based descriptions, but realize many wounds can appear in the same location, having different etiologies. The definitive diagnosis is up to the clinician and interprofessional wound care team.

Care Instructions: To clean your model VATA recommends soap and warm water. Some customers have found applying a barrier/skin prep can give them the adhesion they are looking for.
